Below are the prompts to choose from. You must pass in your work at the end of class. Use MLA format, double space, and title your story. If you have time, edit for spelling, grammar and punctuation. I've left some graphic organizers if you would like to use one to organize your ideas – it's up to you.

1. Your character thinks he/she is good at something, but he/she isn't. Something happens that makes your character realize this. What? What does your character do about it? Write the story.
2. If only he hadn't dropped that lottery ticket...
3. Parents come home from a trip and discover that their teenager has redecorated the house while they were gone. The teenager tries to convince the parents that this was a good idea. One of the parents is partially convinced; the other one isn't. Write the conversation.
4. On your birthday, a strange-looking lady came to your door and handed you a wrapped present. You rattled it. It made a noise. Write a story about this present.
